# **High-Key & Low Key Portrait Assignment**

## **Assignment:**

- Take a series of High-Key and/or Low-Key Images
- Your series needs to include 3 images and can be any combination (3 high, 2 high & 1 low, 1 High & 2 Low, or 3 low)
- Edit each of your images so they have a similar feeling (see edits below).
- Post your images to your blog.
- Fill out the worksheet and rubric and turn it in.

#### **Shooting & Editing High Key images:**

#### On the camera

- Adjust the exposure to be 1-2 stops brighter in the meter.
- Shoot in Aperture Priority Mode
- Try many posses, remember high key is light, airy and happy.

## In the computer

- Crop your image to 8x10 horizontal or vertical whatever is best or the image. Use the rule of thirds.
- Convert the image for smart filters
- Use the camera raw filter and maybe adjust the exposure, decrease the clarity (-10 to -20), & maybe adjust the color tone.
- Add a Hue/Saturation asjustment layer and desaturate the image a bit (-10 to -30)
- Add a curves adjustment to brighten the overall image slightly in the whites and darken the blacks.
- If you want the image to be black & white, add a black/white adjustment layer and choose the preset Maximum White.
- Group the layers, then duplicate and compress/rasterize to make any facial touch-ups.

## **Shooting & Editing Low Key images:**

#### On the camera

- Adjust the exposure to be 0-1 stop darker in the meter.
- Shoot in Aperture Priority Mode
- Try many posses, remember low key is moody and dramatic.

## In the computer

- Crop your image to 8x10 horizontal or vertical whatever is best or the image. Use the rule of thirds.
- Convert the image for smart filters
- Use the camera raw filter and maybe adjust the exposure, decrease the clarity (-10 to -20), & maybe deepen the shadows and the blacks.
- Add a Hue/Saturation asjustment layer and desaturate the image a bit (-10 to -35)
- If you want the image to be black & white, add a black/white adjustment layer and choose the preset Green Filter.
- Group the layers, then duplicate and compress/rasterize to make any facial touch-ups.
- Add a vignette: Create a new layer and fill it with black, add a layer mask, use the gradient tool on radial gradient from white to black and create a hole in the mask, change the blend mode to multiply and adjust the opacity.
