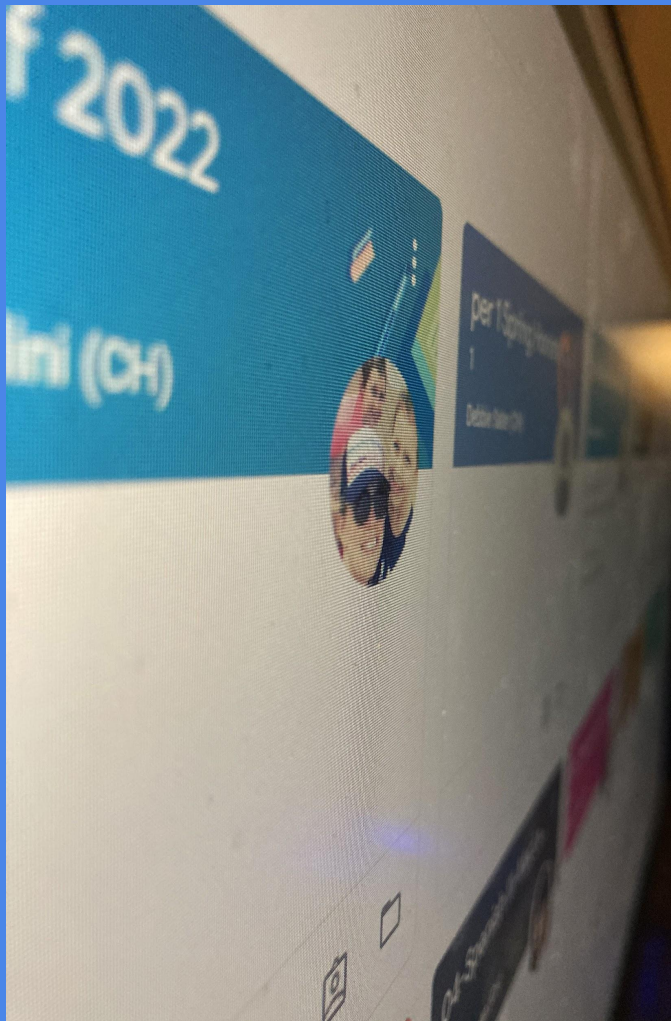


The Pandemic and Home Life
